## **Fragment from summary:**

At the turn of the century the work of the coming generation of poets (P. Janík, V. Klimáček, R. Bielik, J. Urban, I. Kolenič, J. Litvák, V. Puchala) connects the updating of the spiritual motif and the genre in the Slovak lyric with a gesture of negation and decomposition (chapters 1 and 5). Apart from the resistance against tradition and its authorities these tendencies can be also perceived as a need to restructure priorities with a tendency to emphasize individual experiencing, individual expression and immanent forms of spirituality, such as the desire for a deep relationship, and the regard for the good of the world. These approaches also become the instrument of attenuating the pathos or the uncreative conformity.
